

RATE CAPPING REBATE APPLICATION FORM

Discretionary Rebate of Rates – Section 166 (1) (I) *Local Government Act 1999*

(Applications must be received by Council by 31 October 2021)

A rebate of general rates for 2020/2021 may be granted to the Principal Ratepayer of an assessment under Section 166(1)(I) of the *Local Government Act 1999*, on application to the Council, criteria apply. The amount of the rebate will be the difference between the amount of general rates raised for 2020/2021 and the amount of general rates raised for 2019/2020 plus 12.5% of that amount.

The following criteria apply:

- The property must be the principal place of residence
- The land use of the property is Residential, Residential 2 or Primary Production
- There have been no improvements on the land over \$20,000 since 01/07/2019
- The zoning of the land has not changed since 01/07/2019
- The Land Use has not changed since 01/07/2019
- The ownership of the land has not changed since 01/07/2019

Easy steps to see if you are eligible for a rate capping rebate

1	Have both your Rate Notices from this year and last year at hand		
2	From last year's Rate Notice Write down your General Rate only (do not include any concessions, levies or rebates)	\$ <input type="text"/>	A
3	Work out 12.5% of A (The Rate Recap Rebate this year is 12.5%)	\$ <input type="text"/>	B
4	Add them together A + B	\$ <input type="text"/>	C
5	From your current Rate Notice Write down your General Rate only (do not include any concessions, levies or rebates)	\$ <input type="text"/>	D
6	If D is less than C you will NOT be eligible for a rebate		
7	If D is more than C you will be eligible for a rebate	D – C	\$ <input type="text"/>

Rate capping rebates must be \$10 and over to be applicable
