<p>33—Dogs must be registered (1) Every dog of or over 3 months of age must be registered under this Act. (2) If a dog of or over 3 months of age is unregistered, any person who owns or is responsible for the control of the dog is guilty of an offence. Maximum penalty: (a) if the dog is a dangerous dog or a dog of a prescribed breed—\$750; (b) in any other case—\$170.</p>

<p>43—Dogs not to be allowed to wander at large (1) A person who owns or is responsible for the control of a dog is guilty of an offence if the dog is wandering at large. Expiation fee: (a) if the dog is a dangerous dog or a dog of a prescribed breed—\$750; (b) in any other case—\$210.</p>

<p>44—Dogs not to be allowed to attack etc (1) A person who sets on or urges a dog to attack, harass or chase a person or an animal or bird owned by or in the charge of another person is guilty of an offence (whether or not actual injury is caused). (a) if the dog is a dangerous dog or a dog of a prescribed breed—\$750; (b) in any other case—\$315</p>
