Background:

8. In late 2015 (25 October 2015) Elected Members and senior staff were invited to The Cedars to be introduced to the Hans Heysen Heritage Appeal which included:
 - a. a welcoming address from Dr Peter Heysen
 - b. a promotional video produced by Mr Scott Hicks featuring Mr Barry Humphries.
9. Elected Members enthusiastically welcomed the initiative and awaited further communication and information, including a business plan.
10. Ongoing progress has been communicated and most recently a business plan. The Cedars Marketing and Pre-Feasibility Assessment has been received and is attached to this report.
11. The purpose of this report is to update Elected Members with this significant amount of new information and to seek further guidance in pursuing a formal financial support agreement.

Discussion:

12. The Heysen Legacy (in a local, regional and international context) is unparalleled. To begin to appreciate this legacy the following passage has been reproduced:

*Message from the
International President.*

One of the joys of Europe, and particularly of France, is its small museums, many of which are in the homes and studios of the artists who lived and worked there in past times. Many of these such as Monet's studio in Giverny have become major tourist attractions commemorating Monet's art, so closely linked to the beauty of his environment. The homes and studios of Renoir, Rodin, Toulouse-Lautrec and Gustave Moreau are also 'must visits' of art lovers or those who merely enjoy the unique ambiance created by a favourite painter.

To date, Australia has no such place of cultural pilgrimage although the studio of Margaret Olley has, at my own suggestion, been reconstituted in a small art gallery in Queensland and attracts a record-breaking number of tourists and art lovers from around Australia.

Sir Hans Heysen (1877-1968) is undoubtedly one of Australia's greatest and best-loved painters and his home, and the studio where I met him first in 1962, still stands in the setting of great beauty near the historic village of Hahndorf, South Australia, a short drive from Adelaide. There is now a unique opportunity to acquire this shrine for the people of Australia.

I commend this most important project, and have enthusiastically joined the fundraising team, populated by committed and proud Australians and ex-pats, in the role of International President. We look forward to your support.

13. Up until this point in time the Hans Heysen Foundation and Heritage Appeal representatives have maintained a low profile however it is understood the profile will ramp up in the not too distant future as the Heritage Appeal enters the next phase of its campaign. 15. The Hans Heysen Heritage Appeal has the support of many eminent Australians – these people are listed in Attachment 3. Furthermore, the Hans Heysen Foundation membership brings together individuals of the highest calibre with a very appropriate blend of necessary skills. The Heysen Foundation Board Members are:

16. The main features of this project include:
- a. the acquisition of The Cedars property including house, studio and surrounding gardens, approximately 14 hectares
 - b. the construction of a gallery and visitor centre
 - c. the renovation of historic buildings (e.g. the house)
 - d. the acquisition of adjoining property (Sandow Road) where it is understood this property still has many of the old and majestic trees which were the subject of many well-known Heysen artworks
 - e. the retention in The Cedars of many Heysen artworks
 - f. the pre-feasibility assessment (attachment 1) provides a very encouraging forecast of tourism spend and visitation as well as a healthy, positive cash flow
 - g. The facility will also provide revenues and activity from gallery sales, hospitality, and corporate functions, art schools (painting and sculpture).
17. It is anticipated further reports will come to Council in the near future, including an address by the Heysen Foundation Limited and Heritage Appeal.

*Hans Heysen Heritage Appeal
Questions and Answers*

HERITAGE APPEAL

Why is the Appeal necessary?

To raise funds to secure The Cedars and adjoining property, as a unique, historical site, preserving the memory and work of one of Australia's greatest and most renowned artists.

How much is the Appeal expected to raise?

A minimum of \$7m.

Are government funds available for this project?

Local, state and federal governments will be asked to contribute to the Appeal.

Why are three-year gifts sought?

Gifts payable over three years are essential to achieve the \$7m target. Gifts need to be well-considered, and larger than could be expected as immediate cash donations. Payments may be made annually or monthly to suit your situation. The amount may be varied from year to year.

Are gift pledges binding?

They are not legally binding, and if donors' circumstances change, the gifts may be varied.

Are gifts fully tax deductible?

Yes. Gifts to the Hans Heysen Foundation Limited are allowable deductions for tax purposes. Refer to insert entitled 'Taxation Benefits'.

Will my gift be acknowledged?

Yes. All gifts will be personally acknowledged by the Hans Heysen Foundation. It is up to each donor to decide whether they would like to be publicly acknowledged as a contributor to the Appeal.

How can I best help the Appeal?

By making a pledge to contribute over three years, encouraging others by your example, to support the Appeal, and perhaps even volunteering to serve on the gift-seeking team.

How has the \$7m target been arrived at?

The Directors of the Hans Heysen Foundation Limited and members of the Heysen family have commissioned an independent valuation of the assets and properties. The total cost of the project has been valued at approximately \$9m, \$2m of which will be gifted back to the Foundation by the Heysen family.

What is included in the \$7m amount?

Within the target, \$5m is needed to purchase the 14 hectare property inclusive of the artist's studio, the Heysen house, the original furniture and house contents, and a \$2.5m core art collection. An adjoining 17 hectares of land, upon which an additional residence sits, is also included in this amount. The remaining \$2m is sought for the build of a new interactive cultural precinct, allowing for the long-term financial viability of the Foundation and ultimately, the ongoing preservation of the site and assets.

Will the Heysen family benefit from the Appeal?

The Heysen family members have generously preserved and maintained the property at their own expense since Hans' death in 1968.

The family continues to give to this project, generously forgoing over \$2m in order that The Cedars is purchased by The Foundation as a whole piece, and as a significant historical and artistic site for Australian and international visitors to enjoy in perpetuity.

Why can't the property remain in private ownership?

The property is currently owned by four of Hans Heysen's grandchildren, who have maintained the property at their own expense, forgoing any money they may have made had they simply sold the assets when they inherited the property in 1989. As this generation grows older, the next generation consists of some-15 individuals. It is unlikely that the property will remain intact and privately owned within a multi-owner framework.

Why is the family not gifting the property to the Foundation?

The generosity of the Heysen family is at the heart of The Cedars as it currently stands, both in the family's ongoing acquisition of Heysen's art, and the preservation and maintenance of The Cedars' buildings and the property more generally. The family is gifting to the Foundation as much as they are able, and is to be admired for their commitment to this property, which they have personally maintained since 1968.

Significant facts regarding the history of the ownership of The Cedars:

- › On Hans Heysen's death, his eldest son, David Heysen, was willed property known as The Cedars, inclusive of the furniture and fittings and only ONE painting, *Zinnias and Autumn Fruits*.
- › David Heysen was given the option and proceeded to buy, at probate valuation, the remaining adjoining 40 hectares from the Estate.
- › David Heysen's siblings were financially compensated for the house being willed to him.
- › During his lifetime, Hans Heysen had given a number of paintings to each of his children. David Heysen contributed these and others he personally acquired to create the collection now housed at The Cedars.
- › When David died in 1989 he willed The Cedars to his four children who have since that time, maintained and augmented the property, the art collection and other assets, and subsequently opened the property up for public viewing and visits.

Will the Foundation and The Cedars be viable long-term?

Yes. The Foundation has forecast viable income streams to take them into the future.

These include such enterprises as exhibitions, audio tours, educational and musical events, gallery sales, a café and function space.

What happens if we don't support this project?

The likely outcome should this project not proceed is that The Cedars will, either in part or in whole, be sold to private buyers, who may not share the vision to preserve this property or the art collection, and this significant piece of our heritage will be lost.

Taxation Benefits



Gifts to the Hans Heyesen Heritage Appeal are tax deductible and will be promptly acknowledged.

HERITAGE APPEAL

Payments made annually on a pledge over three tax periods may be deducted from the top of your gross income. Gifts may be made in equal amounts or varied to obtain maximum concessions.
