





01 Design Principles

THE CIVIC HEART OF LITTLEHAMPTON

Improve the interface with Old Princes Highway

 Improve the frontage to Old Princes Highway and the Peace Memorial Hall by removing car parking area to the rear and installing paving and landscaping.


Celebrate the heritage and history of the Peace Memorial Hall

- Celebrate the architecture of the Pace Memorial Hall with a new paved forecourt and seating to the Old Princes Highway Interface.
- Relocate the War Memorial and flag poles to align with the rotunda and give it a greater prominence and improved setting.

Create multipurpose spaces for civic events and celebrations

- Rationalise existing shelters and seating to lawn areas into a coordinated picnic area with a larger shelter and BBQ area.
- Extended lawns and landscaping to old car park to create a space for civic and community events such as smaller markets, community club celebrations, Anzac Day etc.





A GREAT PLACE TO PLAY

Extend informal recreation options with areas for ball games

- Replace fencing and allow free access to courts for informal community use for ball games (improve council maintenance and responsibility for surface condition to ensure courts remain fit for organised sports training).
- Add in a basketball hoop to existing courts with line marking for a half court.
- Upgrade netball nets to cater for increased usage.
- Paint a mural to the concrete wall to the boundary.


Refresh and update the playground

- Improve linkages to the opened court areas.
- Extend the play amenity with natural elements such as rocks, logs and sensory planting and a small creek.

Improve seating and shelter for organised sports and the Littlehampton Netball Club

- Integrate storage shed and improved seating and shelter to better facilitate club usage for training.
- Improve safety for night time usage with improved pick up in new car park area linked to storage and shelter area
- Improve safety of pedestrian movements from storage areas to the courts across the grade change to allow for safer transport of equipment.





WELL CONNECTED AND ACCESSIBLE

Clear and safe pedestrian movement to and through the site

- Upgrade footpath to Old Princes Highway.
- Improve access to the courts and new car park with a new footpath to the Eastern edge of the hall with an accessible ramp to the courts.

Improve the safety and capacity of off street car parking

- Increase car parking with a new formal car park to the rear of the hall for hall and park users.
- Improve lighting to rear car park.
- Create new on street bays to cater to short term visitors.





A PLACE TO LINGER AND RELAX

Improved seating, shelter and picnic facilities

- Rationalise existing shelters and seating into a coordinated picnic area with a larger shelter and BBQ area.
- Locate new facilities to allow for a larger clear grassed area for informal recreation and events.
- Retain existing rotunda and repaint metal work to coordinate with new park furniture.

Attractive planting and green space

- Upgrade plantings where required and create a consistent civic palette for the planting scheme.
- · Retain and protect significant trees.



02 Design Principles

PICTURESQUE AND RURAL

Maintain the 'long views' across the site and the sense of openness

- Demarcate a protected zone through the centre of the space.
- Create activity nodes along the boundaries along a path network.

Reinforce the St James school house setting

- Work with the Rotary Club to update the plan for the St James School House land.
- Identify upgrades and works that require council assistance.
- Install interpretive signage.

Retain significant trees

- Protect exiting trees with the site and along fence lines and in verge areas.
- Remove weeds and inappropriate species.

Tree succession planning to ensure a legacy of significant trees

 Buffer planting of large eucalyptus to the perimeter of the site.

Retain the dam

- Improve planting to areas feeding the dam to reduce silt and improve the condition of the water.
- Undertake safety upgrades as required to ensure public safety.





A HUB OF INFORMAL RECREATION

Large grassed area for kick-about and ball games

- Irrigated turf area for ball games approximate 3,800m².
- Associated picnic and BBQ facilities.

Create play opportunities for children, with an emphasis on older children

- Nature play based around the picnic hub and existing tree.
- Swings and other formal play items.

Improved walking trails and rest points


- Complete the trail network to create a loop and better connections to entry points.
- Include distance markers to allow for more structured running groups.
- Place seats and amenity at rest points and entries.


Support dog walking with improved facilities

- Dog bags and rest points.
- Formalised on lead and off leash areas.
- Dog bowl and water point.

Toilet facilities and water

- Permanent toilet facility.
- Drinking water.





A GATHERING PLACE

Improved shade, shelter and seating

 Create a picnic ground with shelters, BBQ and large grassed area to allow for smaller community scaled events and birthday parties.


Provide 3 phase power and water connections

- Investigate options to collocate water and power to amenities building for use by events.
- Install power to shelters to allow for general charging and smaller party usage.

Retain large and small scale un-programmed open spaces to support a variety of different scaled events

- Retain 3 clear spaces for larger events to allow for large venue space and on site car parking, these are 1.4, 1.7 & 1.8 Ha parcels.
- Retain gated access to site to allow for event set up and emergency access vehicles.
- Smaller events could use the new turfed kick about area and St James Schoolhouse heritage style garden.





WELL CONNECTED AND ACCESSIBLE

Improve pedestrian safety to the site

 Work with the Department of Infrastructure and Transport to reduce speed along Old Princes Highway to facilitate safer crossing of pedestrians and vehicle access.

Safe and accessible car parking

- Locate car parking in a visible and easily accessible position off of Old Princes Highway (pending speed limit change).
- Car parking and toilets to be collocated.
- Accessible parking spaces close to picnic and play areas.
- Retain informal verge parking to Fulford Terrace.

Accessible paths to attractions

- Create a smoother surface to existing and new paths to allow for more accessible use.
- Complete the trail network to create a loop and better connections to entry points.







 New rubble path 3-4m wide to create a loop path and link up to existing paths and St James School House.

Perimeter path seating

- 10 7 x bench seats to perimeter path (3 existing retained).
- 1 2 bench seats to have small shelters.

New car parking and access gates

- 1 20 space rubble surface car park
- 20x3 m pull in bay to front boundary (red dashed line

Speed rezoning

Extend 50km/h township zone speed limit to Fulford Terrace (TBC with Department of Infrastructure and Transport).

Tree succession planting

- Tree succession planting to ensure a legacy of significant trees.
- Buffer planting of large eucalyptus to the perimeter of the site.

New fencing to Old Princes Highway

- Post and wire fencing to the highway.
- Corral Gate at entrance.

New dog amenity

- 2 x Bin at Old Princes Highway and Fulford Terrace Gates
- Doggy bag dispensers at each bin

Harrowing and seeding of dry land grass

- 1 Remove the divets in the paddock surface and seed with a mix of winter and summer dry land grasses.
- Denotes items that may need to be delivered as a stage 2, with priority given to the picnic facilities

3,800m² Irrigated turf, approximately 60 x 50m - the average kick is around 30 metres.

PEDESTRIAN LOOP Informal rubble paths to perimeter to match existing, all paths to be regraded to have a compacted smooth surface.



FOOTPATHS TO PICNIC GROUND Compacted fines with edging.



PAVING Littlehampton Clay Brick Pavers to BBQ and toilet areas and Old Princes Highway entry.



SAND Play sand to dam beach.



PICNIC SHELTER Large Picnic Shelter Timber.



SMALL SHELTER 2 x small timber shelters to perimeter path with bench seat.



TOILET 2 cubicle toilet.



SEATING AND PICNIC Quayside RANGE timber slats.



FENCING Rural style hardwood post and 3 wire to residential boundaries, mesh to Old Princes Highway interface.

TREE SPECIES

The Glebe land represents a unique opportunity to plant significant native trees and create a legacy of River Red Gums.

Existing juvenile trees of mixed species will be retained.

Existing buffer trees to fence lines and verges will be largely retained, with unsafe and pest species removed.




BUFFER TREES Eucalyptus camaldulensis (River Red Gum)

UNDERSTOREY SPECIES LIST

Native understorey species will be used that are hardy and thrive in the local climate with minimal maintenance and watering, Species will be low growing and allow for clear sight-lines to be maintained for security and amenity.

Native riparian species will be used to improve water quality and biodiversity around the dam area.

Irrigated turf areas will be Kikuyu or similar, with the remainder of the land to remain un-irrigated and ploughed and harrowed with a summer and winter grass seed mix applied.






